

An Intervention before the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) Participating States and Office of Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) At the Human Dimension Implementation Meeting (HDIM), Warsaw, Poland Working Session 14: Refugees and displaced persons September 18, 2018

The annotated agenda for this working session states correctly that "The question of refugees and internal displacement remains one of the most serious humanitarian and human rights challenges worldwide." 1

Secure Freedom strongly agrees that the challenge of refugees in particular is one that must be resolved.

Today, the concept of burden-sharing has stretched the definition of refugee beyond its actual meaning in international law.

Instead of attempting to relocate religious refugees to the nearest contiguous safe state, or working with allies in the region to accommodate refugees displaced by war, the OSCE region has become a magnet for those seeking a better life who simply break the law and show up by the hundreds of thousands and now millions.

Leaders in the OSCE region dramatically accelerated this invasion in 2015 by not only throwing open doors that had rightly been secured, but by allowing unprecedented numbers to break windows and climb in.

The role of civil society in *inter alia* refugee resettlement to the OSCE region is another matter discussed in the annotated agenda. In this case, far too much of civil society has pushed consciously to bring as many third worlders into the West as humanly possible. Too many of them have struggled to integrate – or, by their own admission, refused to.

This again raises the issue of multiculturalism. In 2011, anti-Brexit² British Prime Minister David Cameron concluded that:

Under the doctrine of state multiculturalism, we have encouraged different cultures to live separate lives, apart from each other and apart from the mainstream. We've failed to provide a vision of

society to which they feel they want to belong. We've even tolerated these segregated communities behaving in ways that run completely counter to our values.³

Protests continue to grow over what is described as "migration" but may be as a recent study has suggested a hostile attempt to destabilize the OSCE region⁴ that continues to lead to violence, rape, murder, and terrorism, including for example in Chemnitz, Germany.

Unfortunately, some protest participants across the OSCE region have resorted to references back to the worst eras in world history – including to the horrifying National Socialist movement that led to World War II and the Holocaust.

But far too often, moderate citizens have been smeared as Nazis simply because they are concerned about their future in a world where politicians bill and coo with each other about how tolerant and diverse their countries are, while their citizens get, literally in the case of Chemnitz, knifed.

Secure Freedom has two questions for those falsely accusing protestors across the region of Nazism: How many armed guards protect your workplace as you sit in meetings rolling your eyes at those without armed guards desperate for your help to protect their families?

Are you one of the elites smearing your fellow human beings pouring into the streets to beg you to stop packing their communities with murderers as Nazis?

For an answer, I would like to cite an expert in Nazism on this matter: Adolph Hitler, whom I utterly loathe:

'It's been our misfortune to have the wrong religion," Hitler once complained. "Why did it have to be Christianity, with its meekness and flabbiness?"

Hitler said, Islam was a "religion of men." The "soldiers of Islam" received "a real earthly paradise" with "wine flowing."

This, Hitler argued, was much more suited to the "Germanic temperament" than the "Jewish filth and priestly twaddle" of Christianity.⁵

So who are the Nazis here:

Parents and children at Trump rallies cheering for someone for finally says "Radical Islamic terrorism"?

Germans protesting in the streets of Chemnitz that yet another Sharia-supremacist migrant stabbed yet another German?

National security experts and local activists trying desperately to warn you that Sharia requires those who follow it to murder Jews and Christians alike until they pay tribute and are humbled?⁶

Or – those who want to focus on the rights of migrants, even when those migrants want to do the murdering?

To answer that question, I would further like to cite an expert in Sharia: Haj Amin al-Husseini, the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, who met with Hitler in November, 1941. At that meeting:

The Mufti offered Hitler his "thanks for the sympathy which he had always shown for the Arab and especially Palestinian cause, and to which he had given clear expression in his public speeches....The Arabs were Germany's natural friends because they had the same enemies as had Germany, namely....the Jews...."⁷

Ask yourself: Are you more expert on Nazism than Hitler?

Are you more expert on Sharia than the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem?

If not, it might be wise to explore the possibility that both were right, and what you are being told by those with a vested interest in you thinking they were wrong is wrong.

Accordingly, Secure Freedom recommends that OSCE participating States add Sharia to current restrictions on activities related Nazism without further modification.
